National Council 132 Report – Richard Huziak

Thunder Bay General Assembly June 28, 2013 9:05 a.m. – 3:25 p.m. EDT Richard Huziak, NC Rep., Tenho Tuomi, NC Alternate Rep.

Thirty-five participants attended this meeting in person and six attended by phone. This, and NC 133, are the very last of the council meetings involving the old RASC governance structure.

Publications - A discussion ensured (moderated by Colin Haig) regarding if our publications will become epublications that could be available by download. Everyone realized, especially for yearly-revised publications like the *Observer's Handbook*, that this becomes a very large volunteer effort. Brenda Shaw reports that she is doing a total revision of the *Beginning Observer's Guide* to update, reorganize and making it user-friendly.

Family Memberships – Denis Grey reports that Centres need to set their fee rates for family members. Family memberships must consist of a regular or life member and then other related family members can be added.

Wood Buffalo National Park & North Frontenac Township Dark-Sky Preserves – Rob Dick announced that the park and township have met the requirements for dark-sky preserve status. Wood Mountain (Alberta) is 4.4M hectares in size; North Frontenac (Ontario) is 116,000 hectares. Council voted to accept the designations. The LPA Committee and Council also adopted a new Nocturnal Preserve designation for natural environments that do not necessarily have astronomy outreach programs.

Webpage – the *members* and *merchandizing* sections of the RASC web page are being rewritten and will make buying, renewal, Centre statistics, reports and advertising easier. This is necessary because current software is more than five years old and does not support some modern media. Centre information will be editable by the local centre through a centre portal at any time for their own marketing reasons. The new software is targeted for mid-September release.

Constitution – The RASC voted to release the *RASC Policy Manual* that guides how the Board of Directors, National Advisory Council (the replacement for the National Centre Representatives), Committees, RASC programming and other sections of the RASC function. The Manual is available on the RASC website under the governance section.

The 2014 General Assembly will be hosted by the Victoria Centre. The 2015 General Assembly will hosted by the Halifax Centre. The 2016 General Assembly has been requested by the Regina Centre.

Thunder Bay General Assembly June 30, 2013 9:00 a.m. – 10:53 a.m.

Eighteen of twenty-nine centres, plus several unattached members were represented at this meeting. Approximately 70 people attended.

The RASC has received the *Certificate of Continuance* from the Federal government that allows the organization to transition to the rules of the CNCA. The rewritten *Bylaw #1* was approved by the membership by special resolution. A motion was carried to set the size of the *Board of Directors* at nine. Beginning immediately after this meeting, the day-to-day business of the Society will be conducted by the *Board*, and the membership will now be represented by the *National Advisory Council* (NAC) who will advise the *Board*. However, any member may make motions directly to the *Board* with 90 days notice per *Section 20.1* of the *Bylaw*. In addition to *Bylaw #1*, the *RASC Policy Manual* is available to all members.

The *Transitional Board of Directors* will be the existing executive plus three new directors determined by the vote of the general membership done by electronic ballet. 473 votes were cast. The *Board* consists of: (existing) Glenn Hawley (Calgary), Colin Haig (Hamilton), Chris Gainer (Victoria), Denis Grey (Toronto), James Edgar (Regina), and (new) Paul Grey (Halifax), Paul Schumacher (Victoria), Francois van Heerden (Toronto). The board has one vacant seat. This board will exist until full transition to the CNCA at the 2014 General Assembly, where all nine positions will be voted in. The first meeting of the *Transitional Board of Directors* occurred June 30 at 11:00 a.m.

Twenty-one NAC reps and observers attended this meeting. Glen Hawley (ex-officio co-chair representing the *Board of Directors*) and Roger Nelson (Calgary) chaired the meeting. Roger was voted, by the members present,

as the Co-chair of the *Council*. Chris Beckett was voted to be *Recorder* for this meeting only. Note that the intent for the choice of NAC reps still falls under each Centre's choice for their representative.

The NAC created their terms of reference through motions conducted during the meeting, and are as follow: most work will be done via email or by telecon, since this council will meet in person only once a year at the General Assembly. The council will follow Robert's Rules of Order. Unattached members can be elected (by their collective choice as stated in the Policy Manual) as members of the NAC.

Next meeting will be approximately two weeks after the next Board of Directors meeting at the end of September or early October.
